The University believes in transparency with regards to our income streams as well as how this income is spent to ensure an outstanding academic and support experience for all students.


The quality of the teaching staff, the course delivery, support and welfare services are key priority areas where we continue to invest money for the exclusive benefit of our students.

The majority of our income comes from postgraduate course fees, followed by income from undergraduate course fees.






80% Postgraduate course fee income

INVESTMENT IN THE STUDENT EXPERIENCE

- The university has achieved top ten placements among universities in the UK for 10 categories in the National Student Survey 2020
- 91%* of our Undergraduate students were satisfied with the quality of the course (2019/20)

FOCUS ON OUTCOMES

- 94% of postgraduate students in employment were in Highly Skilled Occupations 15 months after graduating (2018/19 Graduate Outcomes data).
- 2019 TEF panel concluded that students from all backgrounds achieve excellent outcomes with us, noting that student satisfaction with the provision of academic support is exceptionally high
